East Rochester School Community,

There are so many successes to celebrate as we closed the 2021-22 school year, and we hope each member of our community is reflective of the growth our students experienced during this year.

During the summer months, our leadership team is continuing to chart our path for improvement with large multi-year projects including, but not limited to:

- aligning curriculum to state standards and culturally responsive-sustaining education framework,
- creating authentic, competency-based assessments to monitor students' success,
- implementing social emotional learning to ensure students are ready and able to learn, and
- building respectful and conscientious school culture and behavior that prevents exclusion and promotes those who have been historically devalued and suppressed, keeping in line with our diversity, equity and inclusion efforts.

Our spring semester closed with a renewed focus on school safety and security. We have an active school safety committee and a collaborative approach to reviewing our practices with stakeholders able to provide feedback to a group coordinated by Dan Friday, our Director of Facilities and our School Resource Officer John Vicaretti. As you can imagine, we have a significant range of suggestions, and we continually monitor any changes in guidance issued from the FBI and Secret Service task forces on school safety so we can implement those changes in our practices. One early action item is our management of large groups of visitors to our building during school day events. Gradually, during the 2021-22 school year we resumed larger gatherings as the COVID restrictions from the past two years lifted. Our procedures and capabilities were not yet aligned with our upgraded background check software, so we had some delays in getting visitors in the building for special functions. Another challenge we faced this year was the amount of personnel required to monitor visitors for large events during the school day, given the renewed and undefined level of awareness to security levels. Thankfully, this challenge is similar to all of the challenges we have faced at ER in my two years, in that it is similar to what other school districts have been experiencing. We are thankful to be able to collaborate and problem solve with our neighbors as we look to do better in all aspects of school operations.

I hope you are enjoying your summer, and I look forward to the beginning of the 2022-23 school year this fall.



Season swim passes are available to East Rochester School District residents for a one-time fee that allows unlimited access to swimming from Monday, June 27 through Sunday, August 21. A punch pass provides 15 open swim passes. Family passes can only be used for immediate family members. Children must be at least 6 years old to attend open swim time unaccompanied.
