- Professional development focused around structured literacy implementation, community building circles and conflict resolution, equity and inclusion practices, special education practices, therapeutic crisis intervention, and safety plan enhancements in threat assessment processes and reunification planning.

During the summer months, our building will be undergoing renovations to improve the air quality in our facility. This work includes new HVAC Systems in 28 elementary classrooms.

Enjoy the remaining weeks of summer recess with family and friends. We look forward to greeting new and returning students at the beginning of the 2023-2024 school year on Tuesday, September 5, 2023.

### ER ensembles place at Darien Lake Music Festival

Congratulations to our performers in Wind Ensemble, HS Jazz Band and HS Select Choir on outstanding performances at the Darien Lake Music Festival! Out of a possible 100 points, Select Choir earned a 96.9 for third place out of two dozen choirs; the HS Wind Ensemble earned a score of 97.6 for first place in their division; and ER Jazz earned a 99.0, which not only earned first place in the HS jazz division, but received the Grand Judges Award for the highest overall score of the day! This is the fifth time an ER music ensemble has received this award- the third for ER Jazz- and the first time since 2016.

### ER teams up with feature consultants

#### Culturally Relevant Curriculum in Action with Dr. Jevon Hunter

Using federal funding, East Rochester Schools have been enhancing curriculum to ensure inclusivity of practices and resources. In order to fully engage in this work, and meet the demands put forth in the NYSED Framework for Culturally Responsive Teaching, the District is collaborating with Dr. Jevon Hunter from Buffalo State University to assist with professional development and student training opportunities. Dr. Hunter offered faculty and staff three action oriented book study seminars in the 2022-23 school year. These 1-hour virtual book study seminars allowed staff to delve deeper into the following texts: Culturally Responsive Teaching and the Brain; Start Here, Start Now; and The Civically Engaged Classroom. Each seminar was carefully crafted to meet participant needs and allow for collegial discussion and exploration of a multitude of topics relevant to the implementation of more inclusive practices.

Dr. Hunter also facilitated an end of year curriculum and instruction workshop that was designed to (re)introduce CRE curricular and instructional approaches, strategies, and techniques to implement in curriculum. Moving forward, Dr. Hunter will be directly supporting curriculum work this summer using his inquiry model to begin the process of transforming units of study across grade levels and subject areas for the 2023-24 school year. Finally, Dr. Hunter will also support a number of other summer work days including but not limited to administrator training, teacher leadership training, and new faculty/staff orientation.

### **Pathstones Project**

This year teachers had the opportunity to partner with Kesha James and Shane Wiegand of the Pathstones Foundation Antiracist Curriculum Project to integrate their inquiry into the existing curriculum. The Antiracist Curriculum Project supports schools with co-creation, implementation, and evaluation of curriculum that allows learners to explore and interpret their local history through rich primary sources. Moving forward, the district will work with Pathstones to provide continued professional development and support to integrate additional inquiries at multiple grade levels across the district.

### Tim Brown

Also using federal funding, the district has partnered with Tim Brown of Solution Tree to focus on equity and access for all students by redesigning our Multitiered Systems of Support (MTSS) in the district. In collaboration with district staff and BOCES, Mr. Brown has helped to facilitate new learning and development of systems around professional learning communities that support student success at the K-8 level.

In addition, Mr. Brown has also supported secondary work on shifting grading practices. The teams explored what a grade should represent and discussed what factors teachers could use to determine student grades. Moving forward, the faculty and staff will continue to build their capacity around best practices in grading to support equity, access, and support for all students.

# Classrooms utilizing new technology

This year, teachers had the opportunity to pilot new technology within their classrooms! After a pilot process comparing multiple interactive panels, a survey collecting information on the performance of the boards and reflection with BOCES and what is working in other districts, East Rochester made the decision to bring a new form of technology called Boxlight boards into our classrooms. These new boards proved to be cost effective and useful for our classroom teachers during their everyday instruction.

Features of this new technology include, but are not limited to, support of up to 20 single-point users with 360 degree Touch capabilities that help drive collaborative learning, classroom apps that make daily tasks easier, a smooth and responsive touch experience that feels like writing directly on a whiteboard.

The Boxlight Mimio Pro Series 4, a 75 inch interactive LCD display, will be purchased using ESSA and CRSA funds to replace the 12-year-old Smartboards in 50 classrooms in the elementary school during the summer of 2023. 13 additional Boxlight Mimio Pro Series LCD displays will be installed into Middle Level Academy classrooms over the summer.

### An update on LETRS training

Using federal funding, the District has been training elementary teachers in Language Essentials for Teachers of Reading and Spelling (LETRS), with the goal to train all teachers in grades UPK-5. The course addresses four critical outcomes for effective literacy instruction: understanding the science of reading, converting research to practice, enhancing teacher effectiveness, and transforming instruction. The overarching goal of the professional learning program is to provide all teachers with the essential foundations for teaching structured literacy.

Training began in the 2021-22 school year with Cohort A and to date eleven teachers have completed both the synchronous and asynchronous components of the training. We plan to have approximately 40 staff members trained by the end of 2023-24. The next steps include continued professional development for staff around the implementation of structured literacy; integrating science of reading aligned screening assessments into our benchmarking program; using data from assessments to support students' literacy needs; and aligning our literacy curriculum resources with the science of reading to support high quality Tier 1 instruction and success for all students.

### Decodable readers support literacy

Using federal funds, East Rochester Schools purchased a wide variety of decodable readers aligned to the science of reading, to support the implementation of structured literacy lessons. Decodable readers (books) are simple books written for



the beginning reader and encourage children to sound out words using decoding strategies. These readers directly support the work teachers have been doing with LETRS at the elementary school. Many of the readers were purchased to support high quality Tier 1 reading but others were purchased to support Tier 2 and Tier 3 or struggling readers as well.

The readers arrived in December 2022 and teachers began using them during Tier 1 instruction at our earliest primary levels. These readers will continue to be cataloged in our system and faculty and staff will receive further training and support for their full implementation across grade levels in the 2023-24 school year.

### Summer Swim Pass information

The Kate Gleason Pool will be open to East Rochester Union Free School District residents this summer! Swim passes are now available for purchase online, at https://erschools.cr3.rschooltoday.com/public/home/.

Season swim passes are available to East Rochester School District residents for a one-time fee that allows unlimited access to swimming from Monday, June 26 through Sunday, August 20. A punch pass provides 15 open swim passes. Family passes can only be used for immediate family members. Children must be at least 13 years old to attend open swim time unaccompanied.

Open swim hours will be held Monday through Friday from 1 p.m. through 5 p.m. and Saturday and Sunday from 12 p.m. through 4 p.m. More information is available on the district website, under Athletics. Swim Lessons will be held in two week sessions. beginning July 10. Lessons will run through August 18, and will be held between 8:30 a.m. and 10:30 a.m.

# **ER Summer Meal Program returns**
